# Chapter - 1: General Information and Preparation

ACE and Synopsys® Synplify Pro® for Achronix are provided by Achronix to support the development of user designs for the Speedster®7t FPGA and Speedcore™ eFPGA IP products. The Synplify Pro for Achronix utility synthesizes the user HDL design to produce a physical netlist which is provided to the ACE tool suite to place and route the design in the selected Achronix FPGA. This guide provides details on obtaining, installing and licensing the ACE and Synplify Pro software packages.

# Supported Operating Systems

ACE and Synplify Pro for Achronix are provided for both Windows and Linux platforms. For details on versions, releases and kernels, refer to the Release Notes, "System and Tool Requirements" section for the specific ACE version.

# Minimum Memory Requirements

The recommended system RAM capacity to support ACE and Synplify Pro for Achronix is detailed in the following table.

Table 1: ACE and Synplify Pro for Achronix Recommended RAM Capacity

# Register for an Achronix Support Account

In order to obtain software and evaluation licenses, you must register for an Achronix support account by following these steps:

- 1. Fill in your details using our Registration Form to create your support account. Registration helps us set up your account and enable self-service so that you can request licenses and download our tools and documentation. The registration also creates your support account for answering technical questions. If this is your first time contacting Achronix, a sales person may contact you to obtain additional information about your needs and interests.
- 2. When you register for a support account, you will receive an email with the subject "Welcome to Achronix" which includes an invitation link to the Achronix Support Portal, our technical support site. Click the invitation link to set up your support account. If you do not see this email, please check your spam folder.
- 3. If you have technical questions, please log into the Achronix Support Portal, to file a support ticket. Alternately, when your support account is set up, questions can be sent via email to support@achronix. com. This automatically logs the issue in our support system. Feel free to file separate tickets for each issue you see.

## Download the Software

## **Obtaining Credentials for Download Access**

If you have not already done so, follow the instructions above to register for an Achronix support account. Follow the instructions in the Obtaining Software Licenses (see page 9) chapter to obtain your software licenses. Access to the instructions for downloading the software is granted up to one hour after the licenses are delivered. See the section Downloading Your Software (see page 14) for details.

## Floating versus Fixed Node Licensing

ACE can be installed to use a node-locked or floating license. Node-locked licenses do not require a license server, while floating licenses do. The license server can be hosted on a Linux or Windows machine. Synplify Pro always requires a server.

Floating license configurations require that both client and server machines are connected to the same network. The client machines (i.e., the machines running the ACE and Synplify Pro installations) connecting to a floating license server can be Windows or Linux based regardless of the license server operating system. In other words, a Linux license server can provide licenses to both Windows and Linux clients. Likewise, a Windows license server can provide licenses to both Windows and Linux clients.

#### Note



Node-locked licensing for Synplify Pro is currently only supported on Windows. Linux installations require a floating license. If you request a node-locked license for Linux, you are automatically provided with a node-locked license for ACE and a single-seat floating license for Synplify Pro.

If you are accessing the license server remotely, you need a floating license.

# Chapter - 2: Obtaining Software Licenses

This chapter describes the process of obtaining licenses for ACE design tools and Synplify Pro for Achronix. When installing ACE, you are asked to agree to the Achronix software license agreement. The process is as follows.

## Determine the MAC Address of the License Host

Achronix needs the MAC address of the machine for which the license is being generated and the license type (floating or node-locked). MAC addresses are 12 hexadecimal digits long, represented as six pairs of hex digits, with each pair separated by colons (12:34:56:78:90:AB) or dashes (FE-DC-BA-09-87-65).

#### Windows

To determine the MAC address on Windows platforms, enter the following from the command prompt:

The minimum information required are the six pairs of hexadecimal numbers following the string "Physical Address" (01-23-45-67-89-AB) in the example above).

Alternately, using the GUI:

- 1. From the Start menu, select **Settings**  $\rightarrow$  **Network & Internet**.
- 2. Under "Advanced network settings", select **Network and Sharing Center** to open the Network and Sharing Center window.
- 3. Click the primary connection link in your active networks, for example **Local Area Connection**, to open the Status dialog:




Figure 2: Active Network Status Dialog

4. From the Active Network Status dialog, click **Details...** to open the Network Connection Details dialog as shown in the following figure. The required information is the group of numbers following **Physical Address** (the MAC address) in the form 01-23-45-67-89-AB.




Figure 3: Network Connection Details Dialog

- 5. Make note of the MAC address shown in the dialog.
- 6. Click **Close** on both windows and close the Network and Sharing Center and Settings to return to the desktop.

## Linux

In Red Hat Enterprise Linux (RHEL), the physical network address (or MAC) value is typically called the Ethernet "HWaddr", reported in the form "01:23:45:67:89:AB" (six pairs of hexadecimal digits separated by colons).

From the Linux command prompt, run the ip link command to determine the MAC address of the license server. For RHEL/Rocky 8, the physical network address value is typically shown in group 2: on the second line following the label link/ether. The following is an example of the output:

```
$ ip link

If ACE has already been downloaded, the MAC address can be determined by running rlmutil rlmhostid ether from the Achronix-Linux/bin (or bin64) directory.

## Request an Evaluation License

If you have not already done so, see the section "Register for an Achronix Support Account (see page 7)" to set up a support account with Achronix.



#### Warning!

When accessing a remote license server, running Synplify Pro in batch mode, or if remotely accessing a machine with the tools installed (including remote desktop) request a *floating* license. Requesting a node-locked license for Linux automatically provides a node-locked license for ACE and a single-seat floating license for Synplify Pro.

Follow these steps to request an ACE evaluation license:

- 1. Log into your Achronix support portal account.
- 2. Click the link "Submit a request" located next to your user name.
- 3. Select ACE License Request Ticket under Submit a request:

# Downloading Your Software

Instructions for downloading your software are contained in two restricted-access knowledge base articles:

- ACE Software Releases
- Synplify Pro Releases

Access to these articles is granted with your license request. Follow the instructions in the articles to obtain your software files.



#### Note

Full authorization can take up to one hour to become active after software licenses are delivered.

## **Obtaining Files**

The knowledge base articles above contain links to specific software releases stored on the Achronix download facility. Follow these steps to retrieve your files:

- 1. Click the link in the knowledge base article for the desired software release (i.e., **ACE Software Release 9.2**).
- 2. Enter your email address if prompted.



#### Important!

If using the Firefox browser, or if experiencing difficulties with downloads, turn off the StreamSaver feature by clicking **[StreamSaver: ON]** in the lower right corner of the download window.

- 3. Do either of the following:
  - a. Click the name of the desired file to start a download of the individual file:




Figure 6: Download Individual File Example

b. Click the file or folder icon to add the file to a bundle list to be downloaded in an archive file:




Figure 7: Add file to Bundle List Example

If necessary, click the icon again to remove the item from the list.

Click the **Download** icon in the upper right corner to start the bundle download.



#### Caution

Clicking the folder icon adds every file in the folder to the list. This is not recommended (especially with the device\_overlays folder) because it creates a very large file which might cause issues with download-limited internet plans. Click the folder name to open a list of the files in the folder and download the desired individual files.

# Chapter - 3: Software Installation (Linux)

This chapter covers installing Linux versions of ACE design tools and Synplify Pro for Achronix.

# Installing ACE

## Node-Locked and Floating Licensing

The ACE installation procedure is the same for both Node-Locked and Floating licensing and includes installing the ACE tool itself, along with any device overlays. The device overlays include library files for the specific device, example designs, etc. The device overlays are detected and installed as part of this flow. If more device overlays need to be added in the future, refer to Device Overlays (see page 87).

If access to ACE is to be shared among multiple users, it is recommended to install in the <code>/opt</code> directory. This requires administrator privilege so the installation might require some assistance. One option is to install in the user home directory then, with administrator privilege, copy the installation to the <code>/opt</code> directory.

For a single-user workstation, ACE can be installed in the directory of your choice under the home directory — no assistance required.

Installation requires two directories:

- The download directory (for this example, /home/<userid>/Downloads/ACE)
- The ACE install directory (for this example, /home/<userid>/ACE)

Perform the following steps:

- 1. Create the directories shown above.
- 2. To the download directory, download the following:
  - The ACE software archive (e.g., ACE 9.2 Linux.tqz)
  - The necessary device overlays (e.g., ACE\_9.2\_Linux\_AC7t1500.tgz from the 7nm\_device\_overlays directory)
  - If installing a version of ACE prior to 8.8, the ACX Device Manager MCU overlay is required (e.g., ACE\_8.7.1\_ACX\_DEVICE\_MANAGER\_MCU\_overlay.zip)
  - The ACE\_installation\_linux\_script.zip file (includes the install script, install\_ace.sh )



#### Caution!

Do not install multiple versions of ACE in the same directory or install ACE in the same directory as a previous install.

3. In the directory containing the downloaded files, unzip the ACE\_installation\_linux\_script.zip file. This creates a file called install ace.sh.

4. Set the installation script to be executable:

```
$ cd /home/<userid>/Downloads/ACE
$ chmod 755 install_ace.sh
```

5. Enter the following command to extract the software to the **install** directory:

```
$ ./install_ace.sh -d /home/<userid>/ACE
    - or -
$ ./install_ace.sh -i
    - or -
$ ./install_ace.sh -h
```

#### Table 2: Installer Script install\_ace.sh Options

| Option                                     | Description   |
|--|---|
| -d <install_directory></install_directory> | Specifies the root directory to install ACE into. If omitted, ACE is installed in the current directory.            |
| -i (interactive mode)                      | Prompts for the name of each TGZ file to install. If omitted, all TGZ files in the current directory are installed. |
| -h (help mode)                             | Invokes Help mode, listing all command line options.  |

- 6. (This step not required for ACE 8.8 and later releases)

  Extract the ACX Device Manager overlay file (e.g., ACE\_8.7.1\_ACX\_DEVICE\_MANAGER\_MCU\_overlay.

  zip) into the resulting /Achronix-linux install directory.

  Answer y to any prompts to replace .tcl files.
- 7. If ACE is to be shared among multiple users and was installed under a user home directory, copy the /Achronix-linux directory into the desired "ACE-Install" directory (usually /opt and requires administrator privilege).
- 8. If scripts are to be used outside of the install directory, create an environment variable, ACE\_INSTALL\_DIR, set to the path of the /Achronix-linux directory for use by the scripts to easily access ACE:

From bash:

```
$ export ACE_INSTALL_DIR=/home/<userid>/ACE/Achronix-linux
```

#### From csh:

```
set ACE_INSTALL_DIR = /home/userid/ACE/Achronix-linux
```

9. Install the license file and verify the installation per "FloatingNode and Node-Locked Licensing," in ACE License Installation (Linux). (see page 27)

# **Uninstalling ACE**

To uninstall the current ACE installation, delete the directory used to install ACE (default is /opt/Achronix-linux and requires administrator privilege):


```
$ sudo rm -r /opt/Achronix-linux
```

#### For single-user installation:

```
$ cd /home/userid/ACE
$ rm -r Achronix_linux
```

#### Note

- Administrator privilege is not required to delete an install directory under the user home directory
- It is also recommended to remove the ~/.achronix directory located in the home directory



· When installing a new version of ACE, it is good practice to clear out this directory

# Installing Synplify Pro for Achronix

## Node-Locked and Floating Licensing

The Synplify Pro installation procedure includes installing the tool and the device overlays (the overlays alone can be installed if the tool has already been installed). (see Device Overlays (see page 87)). This version of Synplify Pro (provided by Achronix) must be installed to synthesize designs.

#### Note



If access to Synplify Pro is to be shared among multiple users, it is recommended to install to the /opt directory. This requires administrator privilege so the installation might require some assistance. One option is to complete the installation in the user home directory then, with administrator privilege, copy the installation to the /opt directory.

For a single-user workstation, Synplify Pro can be installed in the directory of your choice under the user home directory — no assistance required.

Installation requires four directories:

- The download directory (for this example, /home/<userid>/Downloads/SynPro)
- The installer directory (for this example, /home/<userid>/Downloads/SynPro/Installer)
- The licensing directory (for this example, /home/<userid>/Downloads/SynPro/Licensing)
- The Synplify Pro application directory (for this example, /home/<userid>/SynPro)

Perform the following steps:

- 1. Create the directories shown above.
- 2. To the download directory, copy the following:
  - The install\_symplify\_pro.sh install script
  - The Synplify Pro Linux release zip archive (e.g., SynplifyPro\_2021.09x-2\_Linux.zip)
- 3. To the **licensing** directory, download the following:
  - The Linux License Manager tarball (e.g., SNPSOEM\_2020.06\_Linux.tar.gz)
- 4. In the **download** directory, specify the installation script as executable:

```
$ cd /home/<userid>/Downloads/SynPro
$ chmod 755 install_synplify_pro.sh
```

5. Before executing the install script, open the synplify.lic file from the email received from Achronix support.

Observe the last group of digits on the first line of the file. This is the *Site ID Number*. The install script prompts for this number:

```
SERVER hostname deadc0de1234 27000

VENDOR SNPSOEM /path/to/snpsoem

USE_SERVER

TMCREMENT symplifyppo achponix SNPSOEM 2020 10 12-jul-2021 1 \
```

6. Execute the install script. The script prompts for the desired action:

```
$ cd /home/<userid>/Downloads/SynPro
$ ./install_synplify_pro.sh
- Press 1 to install Synplify Pro.
- Press 2 to only install overlays.
- Press e to exit.
```

7. Enter '1' for the full install sequence. The script next prompts for the **installer** directory path:

8. Enter the full path to the **installer** directory (A null entry is not allowed nor can '~' be used — full paths must always be entered).

The script next invokes the installer archive which extracts itself to the specified directory. The script then prompts for the desired path to the **application** directory for the Synplify Pro application itself:

9. Enter the full path to the **application** directory. The installer creates a sub-directory, fpga, in the application directory to receive the tool suite.

10. Enter the Site ID number observed earlier from your license file. The installer next displays the EULA and prompts for acceptance:

#### Note



The device overlays for Synplify Pro you select at download are included in the Synplify Pro Linux release zip archive and automatically installed with Synplify Pro.

16. Install the Synplify Pro License Manager as detailed in Synplify Pro License Installation (Linux) (see page 36).

# Uninstalling Synplify Pro for Achronix

To uninstall the current installation, simply delete the fpga subdirectory in the Synplify Pro application directory:

```
$ cd /home/<userid>/SynPro
$ rm -r fpga
$ rm -r .installer
```

#### Note



The .installer directory (located in the **application** directory) contains information used by the installer program. If not removed, the Synplify Pro software cannot be re-installed to the same directory. Root permissions might be required to remove the install directory if placed under the /opt directory.

# Chapter - 4: ACE License Installation (Linux)

## Node-Locked License Installation

- 1. If the ACE license file has already been obtained, skip to step 4.
- 2. After installing the software per Software Installation (Linux) (see page 17), determine the physical network address (or MAC) of the host system:

```
$ ip link
1: lo: <LOOPBACK,UP,LOWER_UP> mtu 65536 qdisc noqueue state UNKNOWN mode DEFAULT group
default qlen 1000
    link/loopback 00:00:00:00:00 brd 00:00:00:00:00
2: enp5s0: <BROADCAST,MULTICAST,UP,LOWER_UP> mtu 1500 qdisc pfifo_fast state UP mode
DEFAULT group default qlen 1000
    link/ether 01:23:45:67:89:ab brd ff:ff:ff:ff:ff
```

Refer to the six hexadecimal numbers separated by colons following the word "ether". Alternatively, the MAC address can be determined by running rlmutil rlmhostid ether from the Achronix-Linux/bin64 directory:

a. From the Achronix-Linux/bin64 directory, execute the following:

```
$ ./rlmutil rlmhostid ether
rlmutil v14.2
Copyright (C) 2006-2021, Reprise Software, Inc. All rights reserved.
Hostid of this machine: 0123456789ab
```

3. Request licenses from Achronix as described in Obtaining Software Licenses (see page 9). Achronix Semiconductor responds with an email containing links to the license files (typically, ace.lic and synplify.lic). Save these files to a safe location.

When ACE is installed as described in Software Installation (Linux) (see page 17) (in this example, under /opt), the directory tree is configured as follows:




Figure 9: Ace Linux Directory Structure

4. Navigate to the directory where the license file was saved, and copy ace.lic into the license subdirectory:

```
Multiple User Example

$ cp ace.lic /opt/Achronix-linux/license
```

#### For a single user installation:

```
Single User Example

$ cp ace.lic /home/<userid>/ACE/Achronix-linux/license
```

5. Start ACE by launching the executable.

```
$ ./<install_directory>/Achronix-linux/ace
```

The License Acceptance Dialog appears:




Figure 10: ACE License Acceptance Dialog

- 6. Review the license agreement and click the I have read... checkbox to agree to the terms.
- 7. Click **OK** to continue.
- 8. After agreeing to the license, the startup window appears:

9. Next, ACE starts up and displays the welcome page:




Figure 12: ACE Welcome Page

If the license was not found or was improperly installed, an error dialog appears:




Figure 13: Startup Error Dialog

Click **Close** to terminate ACE. Refer to "ACE Licensing Issues" in Troubleshooting (Linux) (see page 43) or contact Achronix Technical Support at support@achronix.com.

## Floating-Node License Installation

- 1. If the license file has already been obtained, skip to step 4.
- 2. After installing the software on the client machine per "Installing ACE" in Software Installation (Linux) (see page 17), or Software Installation (Windows) (see page 48), determine the physical network address (or MAC) of the license server:

```
$ ip link
1: lo: <LOOPBACK,UP,LOWER_UP> mtu 65536 qdisc noqueue state UNKNOWN mode DEFAULT group
default qlen 1000
    link/loopback 00:00:00:00:00 brd 00:00:00:00:00
2: enp5s0: <BROADCAST,MULTICAST,UP,LOWER_UP> mtu 1500 qdisc pfifo_fast state UP mode
DEFAULT group default qlen 1000
    link/ether 01:23:45:67:89:ab brd ff:ff:ff:ff
```

Refer to the six hexadecimal numbers separated by colons following the word "ether". Alternately, the MAC address of the license server can be determined by running the RLM utility copied over from the Linux client machine where ACE was installed:

- a. Copy the directory <ACE\_INSTALL\_DIR>/Achronix-linux/bin64 from the client to the license server.
- b. From the bin64 directory, execute the following:

```
$ ./rlmutil rlmhostid ether
rlmutil v14.2
Copyright (C) 2006-2021, Reprise Software, Inc. All rights reserved.
Hostid of this machine: 0123456789ab
```

- 3. Request licenses from Achronix as described in Obtaining Software Licenses (see page 9). Achronix Semiconductor responds with an email containing links to the license files (typically, ace.lic and synplify.lic). Save these files to a safe location.
- Copy the license file, ace.lic, to an appropriate directory on the license server ( /<license\_file\_path>).
- 5. If you have not done so already, copy the directory <ACE\_INSTALL\_DIR>/Achronix-linux/bin64 from the Linux client to the license server. If ACE was installed on a Windows client, refer to Software Installation (Linux) (see page 17), and download and install the ACE Linux version on the server (do not install overlays), then copy the bin64 directory to the final location. The ACE installation may then be removed from the server if desired.
- 6. Edit ace.lic to add the license server name and path to the licensing agent:

```
HOST <license_server_host_name> 0123456789AB 1710
ISV achronix <install_directory>/bin64/achronix_license_agent
```

Where 0123456789AB is the host ID (MAC) of the license server as obtained in step 1.

7. If both the license server and client machines are running on a local network behind a NAT router or another firewall, it is recommended to disable the firewall on the license server to simplify the installation. If it is required that the server firewall remain enabled, skip to the section Installation With Firewall Enabled (see page 35). Otherwise, disable the firewall as follows (root access required):

```
$ sudo systemctl stop firewalld
$ sudo systemctl disable firewalld
```

8. Set the environment variable on the *client* machine:

If the client is hosted on a Windows platform, see Steps 6 through 9 under the topic "Floating Node License Installation" in the ACE License Installation (Windows) (see page 69) chapter. If hosted on a Linux platform:

From a C shell:

```
$ setenv RLM_LICENSE 1710@<license_server_host>
```

#### From a bash shell:

```
$ export RLM_LICENSE=1710@<license_server_host>
```



#### Note

These commands can be added to the .tcshrc or .bashrc file to make them permanent.

Use the following command to check that the environment variable is properly set:

```
$ echo $RLM_LICENSE
```

9. Start the remote licensing manager (RLM) on the license server:

```
$ /<install_directory>/bin64/rlm -c <license_file_path> &
```

#### Note



The line above can be copied into /etc/rc.d to ensure the server is started each time the license server is restarted.

This command returns an indication that the license server is up:

```

10. Start ACE by launching the executable on the client machine:

```
$ ./<install_directory>/Achronix-linux/ace
```

11. Review the license agreement and click the **I have read...** checkbox to agree to the terms. After agreeing to the license, ACE starts up and displays the welcome page:




Figure 14: ACE Welcome Page

If the license was not found or was improperly installed, an error dialog appears:




Figure 15: Startup Error Dialog

Click **Close** to terminate. Refer to "ACE Licensing Issues" in Troubleshooting (Linux) (see page 43) or contact Achronix Technical Support at support@achronix.com.

## Installation With Firewall Enabled

To allow the client machine access to the license server with the firewall enabled, follow these steps:

- 1. Pick a port number to serve as the ISV license server port. Most ports should be free on the license server machine. For this example, use port 5550.
- 2. Edit ace.lic to add the ISV server port to the end of the ISV line in the license file:

```
ISV achronix <install_directory>/bin64/achronix_license_agent port=5550
```

3. Open the license server ports as follows (root access required):

```
$ sudo firewall-cmd --zone=public --permanent --add-port=1710/tcp
$ sudo firewall-cmd --zone=public --permanent --add-port=5550/tcp
$ sudo firewall-cmd --reload
```

4. Return to step 8 (see page 32) in the previous section to complete the installation.

# Chapter - 5: Synplify Pro License Installation (Linux)

This chapter includes the installation of the new License Manager for Synplify Pro 2021.03x on Linux platforms.

# Synplify Pro License Manager SNPSOEM

Synplify Pro 2021.09x-2 requires the use of a license manager, SNPSOEM, for *all Linux licenses*. This license manager replaces the older license manager. The change of license manager increases the efficiency of the license generation process.

Compatible license files are automatically returned when using the ACE License Request form on support. achronix.com.

## System Requirements

The license manager can be run on a different platform than the ACE tools. The requirements for the system hosting the license manager are shown in the following table. Not all of the OS versions listed in the table are supported by ACE. When hosting the license manager on the same system that is running ACE, please review the ACE release notes for the full list of supported OS versions.

**Table 3: SNPSOEM System Requirements**

#### **Obtaining the SNPSOEM License Manager**

The zip archive containing the executable for Linux is located under the /Licensing directory in the Synplify Pro software download folder as detailed in Installing Synplify Pro for Achronix (see page 19).

#### Installing the SNPSOEM License Manager for Linux

The license manager requires a single directory. This example uses /home/<userid>/SNPS.

To install the SNPSOEM license manager in Linux, follow these steps:

- 1. Create the directory shown above.
- 2. If installing a floating license to a separate license server, copy the /home/<userid>/Downloads /SynPro/Licensing directory from the client to the server machine.
- 3. If you have not already done so, request licenses from Achronix as described in How Do I Request an Evaluation License for Achronix Tools?
  - Achronix Semiconductor responds by sending an email containing links to the license files. Save these files to a known location.

4. Extract the contents of the SNPSOEM\_2020.06\_Linux.tar.gz file to the license manager directory:

```
$ cd /home/<userid>/SNPS
$ tar -xvf /home/<userid>/Downloads/SynPro/Licensing/SNPSOEM_2020.06_Linux.tar.gz
linux64/
linux64/bin/
linux64/bin/lmgrd
linux64/bin/lmutil
linux64/bin/sclshoem
linux64/bin/sclshoem_th
linux64/bin/snpsoem
```

The directory where the SNPSOEM license server is extracted, located under the subdirectory linux64 /bin, contains the executables listed in the following table:

Table 4: SNPSOEM License Server Executables

| Executable  | Description                                    |
|-------------|--|
| lmgrd       | Shipped with FlexNet version v11.16.6          |
| lmutil      | Shipped with FlexNet version v11.16.6          |
| sclshoem    | SCL OEM license test client                    |
| sclshoem_th | SCL OEM license test client (threaded version) |
| snpsoem     | SCL OEM license daemon                         |

5. Ensure that the path to lmgrd is added to the local \$PATH variable by including the following in your . tcshrc or .bashrc file:

```
Example for bash

$ export PATH=$PATH:/home/<userid>/SNPS/linux64/bin

Example for csh

$ setenv PATH = $PATH:/home/<userid>/SNPS/linux64/bin
```

6. Copy the license file, synplify.lic, to an appropriate directory on the license server (floating) or client (node-locked) machine (e.g., /home/<userid>/SNPS).

7. Edit synplify.lic to set the hostname to localhost or the actual hostname, and set the path to the Synplify Pro license daemon:

#### Note

On an unconfigured Linux machine, the default hostname can be set to localhost.localdomain. This setting can cause a license problem to occur. Changing the hostname to localhost (using the command hostname), or any other name not containing a period (.) should resolve the issue. Also, the SERVER, VENDOR, USE\_SERVER, PACKAGE, INCREMENT, or # lines in synplify.lic each need to end with a newline sequence. Moving text files between Windows and Linux machines can cause the newline sequence to be lost or altered. If newlines are lost, licensing problems can occur.

8. Navigate to the SNPSOEM license server installation directory, under linux64/bin and start the license server.

```
$ ./lmgrd -c /home/<userid>/SNPS/synplify.lic -reuseaddr -l server.log
```

9. Verify that the license server has started correctly by reading the server.log file. The file should give an indication that both the license server and daemon are up:

```

- 10. Locate the === Network Info === line in the server.log file (2nd occurrence) and make note of the listening port number shown on the line below.
- 11. Locate the === Host Info === line in the server.log file and make note of the host name shown on the line below.
- 12. For a floating license, if both the license server and client machines are running on a local network behind a NAT router or another firewall, it is recommended to disable the firewall on the license server to simplify the installation:

```
$ sudo systemctl stop firewalld
$ sudo systemctl disable firewalld
```

If it is required that the server firewall remain enabled, do not disable the firewall and, instead, open the listening port as follows:

```
$ sudo firewall-cmd --zone=public --add-port=54651/tcp
```

#### Note



This step must be performed each time the license server is restarted as the port number may vary with each invocation.

13. On the *client* system (or the same system if hosting both license server and tools), set the required environment variable to point to the port and host as noted above:

If the client is hosted on a Windows platform, see Steps 8 through 12 under the topic "Installing the SNPSOEM License Manager for Windows" in the Synplify Pro License Installation (Windows) (see page 77) chapter.

On a Linux system, from a C shell:

```
$ setenv SNPSLMD_LICENSE_FILE = 54651@server
```

#### From bash:

```
$ export SNPSLMD_LICENSE_FILE=54651@server
```

To verify that the environment variable is set:

```
$ echo $SNPSLMD_LICENSE_FILE
54651@server
```

14. Start Synplify Pro.

```
$ cd /home/<userid>/SynPro/fpga/S-2021.09X-2/bin
$ ./synplify_pro
```

If the license is properly installed and the license server and daemon are up, the License Agreement dialog appears. Click **Yes** to start the program. The main program window opens.

#### Note

It can take Synplify Pro up to 30 seconds to check out its license and start.




Figure 16: Synplify Pro License Agreement Dialog

If the license is not found or is improperly installed, the following license error page opens. Click **Close** to terminate. Refer to "Synplify Pro for Achronix Licensing Issues" in Troubleshooting (Linux) (see page 43) or contact Achronix Technical Support at support@achronix.com.




Figure 17: Synplify Pro License Error Page

### Note



This error occurs if you log out after setting the SNPSLMD\_LICENSE\_FILE system variable as shown. You must always set the variable after starting the license server as the listening port can change between invocations.

# Chapter - 6: Troubleshooting (Linux)

# **ACE Licensing Issues**

### Checklist

### **Node-Locked Installations**

- Verify that the host ID listed in the license file matches the MAC address of the first Ethernet adapter in the system (typically marked eth0).
- Verify the install path of the license is correct:

```
<install_directory>/Achronix-linux/license
```

Verify that license file has the proper extension (.lic) and does not contain any illegal (nonalphanumeric) characters in the name.

### Floating-Node Installations

- Verify that the correct type of license (nodelocked versus floatingnode) was requested.
- Verify that the host ID listed in the license file matches the MAC address of the first Ethernet adapter in the system (typically marked eth0).
- Ensure that the machine host name (HOST line), and license agent path (ISV path) are set correctly.
- Ensure that the port number listed in the RLM\_LICENSE variable matches the port number listed in the
  license file.
- Verify the license manager is up on the server by checking the logs.

### Note



To create a debug log file, start the license server with the following command (log file is created if not present):

```
$ /<install_dir>/rlm -c /<license_file_path>/ace.lic -dlog
<log_file_path>/logfile.log
```

• If the license manager is running, but the client fails to receive a license, check the license manager logs for an entry showing the license being checked out by the client:

```
01/17 21:12 (achronix) OUT: ace-v1.0 v1.0 by user@client_host
```

...and returned when ACE is closed:

```
01/17 21:19 (achronix) IN: ace-v1.0 v1.0 by user@client_host
```

No entry means that the license request is not reaching the server. Verify that network communication between the client and server is working and that environment variables are properly set.

An entry of DENIED can mean that the number of requested licenses has exceeded the number specified in the license file.

### 32-bit Libraries

When starting the license server, if the error, /lib/ld-linux.so.2: bad ELF interpreter: No such file or directory. is returned, the Linux host is 64-bit but does not have the 32-bit libraries installed. Install the libraries with the following commands:

On any RPM based distribution (CentOS/RedHat/Fedora/Suse/Mandriva):

```
$ sudo yum -y install glibc.i686
```

On any DEB based distribution (Debian/Ubuntu/Mint/Crunchbang):

```
$ sudo apt-get update
$ sudo apt-get install ia32-libs
```



#### Note

For CentOS/RHEL installations, ACE 9.2 is officially supported on CentOS/Rocky/RHEL 8 only.

# Synplify Pro for Achronix Licensing Issues

### Checklist

- Verify that the license file name does not contain illegal (nonalphanumeric) characters in the name.
- Verify that the host ID listed in the license file matches the MAC address of the first Ethernet adapter in the system (typically marked eth0).
- Ensure that first Ethernet adapter in the system (typically marked eth0) is active.
- For "nodelocked" installations, ensure that the host name in the license file is set to localhost.

### Note



- 1. Synplify Pro node-locked licenses for Linux are actually single-seat floating licenses with the license server present on the client machine. When using a remote server, a floating license should be requested instead.
- 2. The host name can be changed via the command hostname.
- Verify that the path to snpsoem in the VENDOR line is set correctly.
- Ensure that the license file is formatted properly:
  - Do *not* remove the USE\_SERVER line. This keyword must exist on a line by itself, before any INCREMENT lines.
  - Remove any VENDOR or DAEMON lines for nonsnpsoem vendor daemons.
  - All lines should start with SERVER, VENDOR, USE\_SERVER, PACKAGE, INCREMENT, or #.

- Lines may only wrap after a space and a continuation character (\), and all comment lines must start with #.
- Blank lines must not be present in the license file as this can cause problems.
- Strip out all extraneous characters, such as > or >> symbols at the beginning of lines.
- Ensure that the port number referenced in the SNPSOEM\_LICENSE\_FILE environment variable matches the port number listed in the license file.
- Problems can occur in batch mode when the license server has both Synplify Pro for Achronix and other Synopsys licenses available. This situation can be avoided by setting an environment variable that sets license preference or using a command line switch that sets license preference:

```
Environment variable
------
Variable: SYNPLIFYPRO_LICENSE_TYPE
Value: synplifypro_achronix

Command line switch
------
%synplifypro -batch -licensetype synplifypro_achronix <project_file>
```

## License Server

If the command Imstat returns:

```
Cannot find license file -1,359:2 (No such file or directory)
```

...even though the license path is set correctly, try running the command with the following option:

```
$ lmstat -a -c /license_path/synplify.lic
```

If the license file is valid, the program returns the server and daemon status.

## Running Multiple License Servers

When running a license server, it is recommended that the version of **Imgrd** be equal to or greater than the highest version of the vendor daemon. Also, two of the same vendor daemons cannot be running on the same system. If multiple Synopsys product licenses are being hosted on this server, the license features for Synplify Pro Achronix have to be appended to the existing license file using the following steps:

- 1. Stop the license server started for the Synplify Pro Achronix feature.
- 2. Append the INCREMENT lines for Achronix SynplifyPro to the main license file:

```
INCREMENT SSST
INCREMENT SCL_WAN_DISABLE
INCREMENT synplifypro_achronix
```

- 3. Confirm the versions of **Imgrd** and **snpsoem** being used with the main license file.
- 4. Run lmutil lmreread on the main license server, and then lmutil lmstat -a to confirm that the Synplify Pro Achronix feature is being read.

## Other Issues

### Host Name Resolution

For floatingnode (clientserver) licensing applications, the license manager normally uses the port@host convention for the license file environment variable set on the client. For example, for ACE licensing:

RLM\_LICENSE=1710@main-server

Within some network topologies, the host name might not resolve. In this case, the actual IP address of the license server can be substituted for the host name as a workaround. For example:

RLM LICENSE=1710@192.168.0.15



#### Note

This workaround might not be durable, as the server IP address could change.

### JTAG Communication Fails On Ubuntu Linux

If Bitporter JTAG communication fails after installing ACE on Ubuntu Linux, enter the following command:

\$ sudo <install\_dir>/Achronix-linux/system/cmd/install\_acx\_bitporter\_usb.pl

## "Bad ELF interpreter: No such file or directory"

When starting the Synplify Pro license server on RHEL/Rocky 8, the server.log file might display an error similar to the following:

bad ELF interpreter: No such file or directory.

This occurs when the installation is based on the minimal install. A critical library is missing. To add the missing library, execute the following command from root:

\$ dnf install -y redhat-lsb.x86\_64

## "Bad version number - must be floating point number, with no letters" Error Resolution

The most probable reason for the error is the **LANG** environment variable which determines the local language. Different languages handle the decimal point (.) differently. In Europe, for instance, a comma (,) is used instead of the decimal point (.). This is the most likely cause: the value set for the **LANG** environment variable is converting the decimal point (.) value to a comma (,).

The solution is to add or create an additional environment variable with a value of **en\_US.UTF-8**. Any one of the following should work:

```
LC_CTYPE
LC_NUMERIC
LC_TIME
LC_COLLATE
LC_MONETARY
LC_MESSAGES
LC_ALL (sets all categories to a locale)
```

For example, the **LC\_NUMERIC** variable can be set to:

```
LC_NUMERIC="en_US.UTF-8"
```

# Chapter - 7: Software Installation (Windows)

## Installing ACE



### Warning!

If this is not a first-time installation, refer to the Upgrading an ACE Installation (see page 59) section before proceeding. It is generally recommended to uninstall previous versions of ACE before attempting to install a new version of ACE.

ACE installation includes installing both ACE itself, along with any device overlays. These device overlays include device-specific library files, example designs, etc. Previous ACE device overlay files for Windows only used the \*.zip extension. In the ACE 9.0 and later releases, only \*.tgz extensions for device overlays are available for Windows. The ACE 9.2 Windows installer allows adding the device overlays during the install process. This installer uses the \*.tgz extension for the overlay files.

Follow these steps to install ACE on Windows:

- Create an empty directory to receive the download files (e.g., C:\Users\<username>\Downloads\ACE).
- 2. Download the ACE\_9.2\_Windows.exe, and all the device overlays needed for the desired version of ACE into this directory. The device overlays are detected and installed as part of this flow. If more device overlays need to be added in the future, see the Device Overlays (see page 87) chapter.

### Note



Only download the files for one version of ACE into this directory; do *not* mix files from multiple versions of ACE.

- 3. Run the ACE\_9.2\_Windows.exe installer by right-clicking the file in Windows Explorer and select Run as Administrator.
- 4. If the software was installed previously, the installer asks whether to remove the previous versions (see the following figure). If previous version(s) of ACE are *not* desired on this client, click **Yes** to proceed with automatically uninstalling the most recent previous installation of ACE (regardless of version number). with multiple previous versions of ACE, it is necessary to manually uninstall them. To retain a previous version or versions, click **No** to proceed to step 5.




Figure 18: Remove Previous Version Dialog

The installer verifies the archive and opens the Installer Language dialog (see the following figure). Select the desired language from the pulldown menu and click **OK** to open the Achronix CAD Environment Setup dialog.




Figure 19: Installer Language Dialog

6. From the Setup dialog, click **Next >** to open the License Agreement dialog.




Figure 20: Achronix CAD Environment Setup Dialog

7. From the License Agreement dialog, after reviewing the license, click I Agree.




Figure 21: License Agreement Dialog

From the Choose Components dialog, select the desired components to install. For example, uncheck
 Achronix CAD Environment to install only the software and drivers needed for programming. Click Next
 to continue.




Figure 22: Choose Components Dialog

9. From the Choose Users dialog, select the first option if this computer is shared with other users. Otherwise, select the second option. Click **Next** > to continue.




Figure 23: Choose Users Dialog

10. From the Choose Install Location dialog, set the desired install directory by either typing the path under Destination Folder or by clicking the Browse button to navigate to the desired location. If a previous version, or versions, of ACE are being retained, pick a location other than where a previous version is installed.



### Caution!

It is strongly recommended to replace the default **Destination Folder** string with one not including spaces. Spaces are known to cause problems with scripts. The recommended location string is  $C:\Achronix\ACE\<\colored{colored}$  Achronix\_CAD\_Environment as shown in the following figure.

Click **Next** > to continue.




Figure 24: Choose Install Location Dialog

11. From the Choose Start Menu Folder dialog, accept the default to create a unique ACE Start Menu folder. Select an existing folder if otherwise desired. Click **Install** to start file extraction and begin installation. If a Microsoft Visual C++ installer appears, click **Yes** to accept the license agreement.




Figure 25: Choose Start Menu Folder Dialog

12. The Installing Dialog appears showing the installation progress.




Figure 26: Installing Dialog

13. During the install process, the C++ 2005 Redistributable install dialog appears.




Figure 27: C++ 2005 Redistributable Install Dialog

Click **Next** on the Installing dialog when the process completes.

- 14. If the device overlay .tgz files were placed in the same directory as the installer, they should appear in the list window on the Device Overlay Install dialog. If the device overlay files are in a separate directory, do the following:
  - a. Click the [...] browse button.
  - b. Navigate to the download directory containing the device overlay(s).
  - c. Select the desired device overlay file.
  - d. Click Add followed by the [...] browse button to select any additional files.

Click **Next>** to continue (this process can take several minutes as the overlay files are quite large and there is little feedback).




Figure 28: Device Overlay Install Dialog

15. For a first-time installation, from the License Selection dialog, select **Manually install license later** and click **Next** >. 


Figure 29: License Selection Dialog

16. From the Completing Setup dialog, click **Finish**. Install the license file and verify the installation per the ACE License Installation (Windows) (see page 69) chapter.




Figure 30: Completing Setup Dialog

## **Environment Variable**

For Achronix script flows and other relocatable designs in which different versions of ACE may be supported, it is strongly recommended to create an environment variable, ACE\_INSTALL\_DIR, to set the location of the directory containing the ACE executable.

Follow these steps to create the variable:

- 1. From the Start menu, select Windows System → Control Panel → System.
- 2. On the **About** page under **Related settings**, select **Advanced system settings** to open the System Properties dialog (see the following figure).
- 3. Click Environment Variables... to open the Environment Variables dialog.




Figure 31: System Properties Dialog

4. Under the System variables section, click New to open the New System Variable dialog.





Figure 32: Environment Variables Dialog

Variable value: C:\Achronix\ACE\<version>\Achronix\_CAD\_Environment






Figure 33: New System Variable Dialog

```
C:\>echo %ACE_INSTALL_DIR%
```

The proper response is:




Figure 34: Environment Variable Verification

# Upgrading an ACE Installation

Each version of ACE should ideally be installed into a new, empty directory! Never install ACE in the same directory as a prior install, unless that prior version has already been uninstalled first.

- 1. Disconnect any USB Bitporters
- 2. (If a node-locked license is being used for ACE:) Copy the license/\*.lic file from the ACE installation directory to another location (somewhere not under the ACE installation directory).
- 3. Optionally, uninstall the prior version of ACE
- 4. Install the desired version of ACE to a new directory
- 5. (If a node-locked license is being used for ACE:) Copy the license/\*.lic file back to the proper location within the new ACE installation directory.
- 6. Re-connect any USB Bitporters
- 7. Run ACE

# Uninstalling ACE



#### Caution!

The ACE (un)installer does not fully support multiple copies of ACE being installed on the same machine simultaneously. The uninstaller always uninstalls the most recently installed version of ACE, regardless of version number. See the section Upgrading an ACE Installation (see page 59) for further details and workarounds.

### To uninstall ACE on Windows:

- 1. Click Start. Right-click Achronix CAD Environment. Select Uninstall and skip to step 3.
- 2. Alternately, Select Start  $\rightarrow$  Windows System  $\rightarrow$  Control Panel  $\rightarrow$  Programs and Features.
- 3. From the Uninstall or change a program dialog, select Achronix CAD Environment and click Uninstall.




Figure 35: Uninstall Or Change a Program Dialog

4. From the Achronix CAD Environment Uninstall dialog, click **Uninstall** to start the uninstall process. The window closes when the process completes.




Figure 36: Achronix CAD Environment Uninstall Dialog

# Installing Synplify Pro for Achronix



### Warning!

If the license configuration is node locked when upgrading Synplify Pro for Achronix, any existing license files in the directory \Synopsys might be removed or overwritten. Be sure to save a copy of the license file in a safe place for reuse after a program upgrade.

Follow these steps to install Synplify Pro:

- 1. Create an empty directory to receive the download files (e.g., C:\Users\<username>\Downloads\SynPro).
- 2. Download the Synplify Pro ZIP file (e.g., SynplifyPro\_2021.09x-2\_Windows.zip) and extract its contents.

### Note



The device overlay ZIP files are located in the Synplify Pro ZIP file, but are installed after the Synplify Pro installation.

3. Doubleclick the install program (e.g., fpga\_vS-2021.09X-2\_win.exe) to begin the install.

4. From the Synplify Pro for Achronix Setup dialog, click **Next** > to open the License Agreement dialog.




Figure 37: Synplify Pro for Achronix Setup Dialog

5. Select I accept the terms of the license agreement followed by Next >.




Figure 38: Synopsys End-User License Agreement

6. From the Choose Components dialog, ensure that achronix\_oem is checked and click Next >.




Figure 39: Choose Components Dialog




Figure 40: Choose Install Location Dialog




Figure 41: Choose Start Menu Folder Dialog




Figure 42: Start Copying Files Dialog




Figure 43: Installing Progress Dialog




Figure 45: InstallShield Wizard Complete Dialog




Figure 46: Uninstalling Synplify Pro




Figure 47: Uninstall or Change a Program Dialog




Figure 48: Synplify Pro Uninstall Wizard Dialog




Figure 49: Synplify Pro Uninstall Progress Dialog




Figure 50: Synplify Pro Uninstall Complete Dialog

# Chapter - 8: ACE License Installation (Windows)

## Node-Locked License Installation

Follow these steps to install a node-locked license on Windows:

- 1. If the ACE license file has already been obtained, skip to step 4.
- 2. Determine the physical network address (or MAC) of the host system:
  - a. Enter the following at the command prompt:

```
C:\>ipconfig /all
.
.
.
.
.
Physical Address. . . . . . . : 01-23-45-67-89-AB
```

The minimum information required are the six pairs of hexadecimal numbers following the string "Physical Address" (01-23-45-67-89-AB in the example above).

- 3. Request licenses from Achronix as described in Obtaining Software Licenses (see page 9). Achronix Semiconductor responds with an email containing links to the license files (typically, ace.lic and synplify.lic). Save these files to a safe location.
- 4. When ACE is installed as described in the Software Installation (Windows) (see page 48) chapter, save ace.lic to the directory

\Achronix\ACE\<version>\Achronix\_CAD\_Environment\Achronix\license, or to the location used during install if the default location was overridden.

5. To verify installation and licensing, select from the Start menu, **Achronix CAD Environment <version>** → **Achronix CAD Environment <version>** to start ACE. ACE starts up and displays the welcome page shown below.

If the license is not found or is improperly installed, an error dialog (shown below) appears. Click **Close** to terminate. Refer to Troubleshooting (Windows) (see page 85) or contact Achronix Technical Support at support@achronix.com.




Figure 52: Startup Error Dialog

It is possible that the windows firewall configuration might prompt for permission to allow ACE access to the network (an example is shown below). Grant permission by clicking **Allow access**.




Figure 53: Windows Security Alert Dialog

# Floating Node License Installation

For a floating license, the option exists to host a license server on either a Linux or Windows platform, even if the specific license(s) are intended for use on Windows. If hosting a license server on Linux, refer to the ACE License Installation (Linux) (see page 27) chapter. Refer to the following if hosting the license server on Windows.

After installing the software on the client as described in the "Installing ACE" topic in the chapter, Software Installation (Windows) (see page 48) follow these steps:

- 1. Determine the physical network address (or MAC) of the license server. Refer to the "Windows" section under the topic "Determine the MAC Address of the License Host" in the chapter Obtaining Software Licenses (see page 9).
- 2. Request licenses from Achronix as described in Obtaining Software Licenses (see page 9). Achronix Semiconductor responds with an email containing links to the license files (typically, ace.lic and synplify.lic). Save these files to a safe location.
- 3. Copy the license file ace.lic to an appropriate directory on the license server (for this example, C: \Achronix\License).
- 4. Copy the following directory from the client to the license server:

  C:\Achronix\ACE\<version>\Achronix CAD Environment\Achronix\bin.

5. Edit ace.lic to add the license server name and path to the licensing agent:

```
HOST servername 0123456789AB 1710
ISV achronix C:\Achronix\ACE\9.0\Achronix_CAD_Environment\bin\achronix_license_agent.exe
```

Where 0123456789AB is the host ID (MAC) of the license server determined in step 1.

- 6. Set the environment variable on the *client* machine:

  If the client is hosted on a Linux platform, see Step 7 under the topic "Floating Node License Installation" in the ACE License Installation (Linux) (see page 27) chapter.
  - a. From the Start menu, select Windows System  $\rightarrow$  Control Panel  $\rightarrow$  System.
  - b. On the **About** page under **Related settings**, select **Advanced system settings** to open the System Properties dialog (see the following figure).
  - c. Click **Environment Variables...** to open the Environment Variables dialog.




Figure 54: System Properties Dialog




Figure 56: New System Variable Dialog

The environment variable can also be set from the command line (but is forgotten as soon as the command line window is closed):



```
C:\>set RLM_LICENSE 1710@servername
```

To verify that the environment variable is set:

```
C:\>echo %RLM_LICENSE%
```

10. Start the remote licensing manager (RLM) on the license server. The remote licensing manager runs as a Windows service process at startup. A service process set up to start automatically at boot time runs as long as the system is up.

```
rlm [-c <lic file path>] [-dat]
    [-dlog [+]<debug log path>] [-info] [-l] [-noudp]
    [-nows | -ws <port>] [-x [rlmdown|rlmremove]] [-v]
    [-verify] [-z]
    [-install_service] [-delete_service] [-service_name <service name>]
    [-display_name <service display name>]
    [-user <service user name> -password <service password>]
    [-isv_startup_delay <ISV server startup delay>]
```

To install RLM as a service, enter the following in the bin directory from a command prompt running as administrator:

```
> rlm -install_service -service_name rlm-xyz -dlog C:\Achronix\rlm.log -c C:
\Achronix\License\ace.lic
```

This example installs rlm.exe as a service under the name "rlm-xyz". When started via the Services control panel or at boot time, rlm.exe receives arguments from the file C:\Achronix\License\ace.lic, and writes debug log information to the file C:\Achronix\rlm.log.

- 11. Start the newly-installed RLM service:
  - a. Select Start → Windows System → Windows Administrative Tools.
  - b. From the Administrative Tools panel, double-click Services.
  - c. Find and right-click the assigned RLM service name in the list.
  - d. Select Start.
  - e. Observe the status "Running" next to the service name in the list.

The following log file excerpt is an example indication that the license server is up:

### Server Firewall Settings

If both the license server and client machines are running on a local network behind a NAT router or another firewall, it is recommended to disable the firewall on the license server to simplify the installation. Follow these steps to disable the firewall on the *server* machine:

- 1. Click Start → Windows System → Control Panel.
- 2. Click Windows Defender Firewall.
- 3. Click Turn Windows Defender Firewall on or off:




Figure 57: Windows Defender Firewall Settings Dialog

4. Select Turn off Windows Defender Firewall in both Private and Public sections:




Figure 58: Windows Defender Firewall Customize Settings Dialog

5. Click **OK** and close the control panel.

Proceed from Step 5 (see page 70) in the previous section to verify operation of ACE on the *client* machine.

## Chapter - 9: Synplify Pro License Manager SNPSOEM

Synplify Pro 2021.09x-2 requires the use of a license manager, SNPSOEM, for *floating Windows licenses*. This license manager replaces the older license manager. The change of license manager increases the efficiency of the license generation process.

Compatible license files are automatically returned when using the ACE License Request form on support. achronix.com.

### System Requirements

The license manager can be run on a different platform than the ACE tools. The requirements for the system hosting the license manager are shown in the following table. Not all of the OS versions listed in the table are supported by ACE. When hosting the license manager on the same system that is running ACE, please review the ACE release notes for the full list of supported OS versions.

#### Windows Node-locked Licenses

The SNPSOEM license manager is not used on Windows platforms with node-locked licenses. In the case of a Windows node-locked license, it is only necessary to save the license file to a known location (in this example, C:\Synopsys\SNPS\License) and set the environment variable, SNPSLMD\_LICENSE\_FILE, to the path of the license file installed on the host machine. For details on how to set the environment variable, refer to steps 8–11 under Installing the SNPSOEM License Manager for Windows (see page 78).

#### Note:



Node-locked licenses only operate on a machine which you can physically access. If you are remotely accessing the machine, you *must* use a floating license.

#### Linux Node-Locked Licenses

If you requested a Linux node-locked license, you received a floating license for Synplify Pro. That license does not work in a Windows node-locked configuration.

### Obtaining the SNPSOEM License Manager

The zip archive containing the executable for Windows is located under the directory /Licensing in the software distribution folder.

### Installing the SNPSOEM License Manager for Windows

To install the SNPSOEM license manager in Windows, follow these steps:

- Determine the physical network address (or MAC) of the license server. Refer to the "Windows" section under the topic "Determine the MAC Address of the License Host" in Obtaining Software Licenses (see page 9).
- 2. Request licenses from Achronix as described in How Do I Request an Evaluation License for Achronix Tools?. Achronix Semiconductor responds with a file, synplify.lic, as an email attachment. Save this file to a safe location.
- 3. When Synplify Pro for Achronix is installed as described in Installing Synplify Pro for Achronix (see page 61), save synplify.lic to a directory (e.g., C:\Synopsys\SNPS\License). The license file location is assigned to an environment variable later in this process.
- 4. Download SNPSOEM\_2020.06\_Windows.zip from the Licensing directory on the Synplify Pro download page. Extract the contents of the zip file where you want to run the license server software (e.g., C:\Synopsys\SNPS). The zip file includes the following executables:

5. (Floating licenses only) Edit synplify.lic to set the hostname1 to "localhost" or the actual hostname, and set the path to the Synplify Pro license daemon:

6. From the command line, navigate to the license server directory in which the zip file is extracted (e.g., C:\Synopsys\SNPS) and start the license server:

```
C:\> cd \Synopsys\SNPS\win64\bin
C:\Synopsys\SNPS\win64\bin> lmgrd -c <oem_license_file_path> -z
```

If the Windows Security Alert Dialog appears, click Allow access.

7. This command returns a log listing status information. Make note of the **Listening port** value in the "=== Network Info ===" section near the end:

8. Do not close the command prompt window. Verify that the license server has started correctly by entering the following from a *second* command prompt:

  - a. From the Start menu, select Windows System  $\rightarrow$  Control Panel  $\rightarrow$  System.
  - b. Scroll the About section down and, under **Related settings**, select **Advanced system settings** to open the System Properties dialog (see below).
  - c. Click the Environment Variables... button to open the Environment Variables Dialog.




Figure 59: System Properties Dialog

10. On the Environment Variables dialog, under the **System variables** section, click the **New** button.




Figure 60: Environment Variables Dialog

11. For a node-locked license, enter the following: Variable name: SNPSLMD\_LICENSE\_FILE Variable value: C:\Synopsys\SNPS\License




Figure 61: System Variables Editor Dialog Node-Locked Example




Figure 62: System Variables Editor Dialog Windows Server Example

Variable Value: <a href="mailto:server\_IP\_addr"><a href="mailt




Figure 63: System Variables Editor Dialog Linux Server Example

- 12. Click **OK** to set, followed by **OK** to close the Environment Variables dialog and again to close the System Properties dialog.
- 13. Start Synplify Pro.




Figure 64: Synplify Pro Start Menu Item

Note

It can take Synplify Pro up to 30 seconds to check out its license and start.

If the license is not found or is improperly installed, a license error page opens. Click **Close** to terminate. Refer to "Synplify Pro for Achronix Licensing Issues" in Troubleshooting (Windows) (see page 85) or contact Achronix Technical Support at support@achronix.com.




Figure 65: Synplify Pro License Error Page

It is possible that the windows firewall configuration might prompt for permission to allow Synplify Pro access to the network (an example is shown below). Grant permission by clicking **Allow access**.




Figure 66: Windows Security Alert Dialog

#### Running Both Old and New License Managers on the Same System

It is possible to run both license managers on the same system. For example, the license environment variable can be set up using different ports as in the example below:

SNPSLMD\_LICENSE\_FILE 1234@hostname:5678@hostname

Here, 1234 and 5678 are different port numbers but the hostname is the same. SNPSLMD\_LICENSE\_FILE or LM\_LICENSE\_FILE and both the ports can be used in the same path.

## Chapter - 10: Troubleshooting (Windows)

This chapter provides troubleshooting hints for Windows licensing.

## **ACE Licensing Issues**

#### Checklist

- Verify the install path of the license is correct:

  C:\Achronix\ACE\<version>\Achronix\_CAD\_Environment\Achronix\license
- Verify that license file has the proper extension (.lic) and contains no illegal (nonalphanumeric) characters in the name.
- Verify that the host ID listed in the license file matches the MAC address of an enabled Ethernet adapter in the system.
- Ensure the program path below has been added to the Path statement: C:\Achronix\ACE\<version>\Achronix\_CAD\_Environment
  The Path variable is set as follows:
  - 1. Select from the Start menu Windows System → Control Panel → System → Advanced system settings to open the System Properties dialog.
  - 2. From the Advanced tab, click **Environment Variables**.
  - 3. highlight the **Path** string and click **Edit**.

#### Other Issues

When upgrading ACE, any existing license files in the directory \license might be removed. Be sure to save a copy of the license file in a safe place for reuse after a program upgrade.

### Synplify Pro for Achronix Licensing Issues

#### Checklist

- Verify the install path of the license is correct, for example: C:\Synopsys\synplify.lic
- Verify that license file contains no illegal (nonalphanumeric) characters in the name.
- Ensure that the INCREMENT symplifypro\_achronix ... lines in the license file start on new lines.
- Verify that the HOSTID listed in the license file matches the MAC address of an enabled Ethernet adapter in the system.

Ensure that the SNPSLMD\_LICENSE\_FILE environment variable exists and is set to the correct install
path for the node-locked license file or the server ID for a floating license, as shown in the following table:
 Table 7: Environment Variable Examples

The Path variable is set as follows:

- Select from the Start menu Windows System → Control Panel → System → Advanced system settings to open the System Properties dialog.
- 2. From the Advanced tab, click Environment Variables.
- 3. highlight the Path string and click Edit.

#### Other Issues

### Save the License File when Performing an Upgrade

When upgrading Synplify Pro for Achronix, any existing license files in the directory \Synopsys might be removed or overwritten. Be sure to save a copy of the license file in a safe place for reuse when performing a program upgrade.

#### Ethernet Cards Present on the System

If the host system has multiple Ethernet cards, first install the Synplify license manager and run lmutil lmhostid from the command prompt to get the reported MAC address. Then, use this MAC address when requesting the license.

### ACE Startup Error Due to Missing DLL Component in Windows 10

In some Windows 10 configurations, the following error dialog might appear when invoking the ACE GUI. This error occurs due to a missing DLL component from the Visual Studio redistributable installer. This situation can be resolved by reinstalling the vc\_redist.x64.exe executable. This executable can be downloaded from the following link: https://www.microsoft.com/en-ca/download/details.aspx?id=48145.




Figure 67: ACE Startup Error

## Chapter - 11: Device Overlays

Support for Achronix devices (e.g., Speedcore™ eFPGA IP or Speedster®7t FPGAs) is provided in ACE and Synplify Pro with the use of overlays. Achronix provides device overlays for downloading. All device overlays must be installed for the devices planned to be used.

## **ACE Overlays**

Device overlays for ACE are delivered as a tar file containing the additional library and system files required for the device in use. For example, ACE\_9.0\_Linux\_AC7t1500ES0.tgz contains the necessary overlays to support the Speedster7t AC7t1500 device in ACE version 9.0 in both Linux and Windows. To install ACE along with the device overlays on Linux, simply use the install\_ace.sh script provided (refer to Installing ACE (see page 17) for directions). For Windows, the device overlays are also installed during the ACE installation process (refer to Installing ACE (see page 48) for directions). If it is necessary to install device overlays manually, use the following directions.

The tar file contains a directory structure similar to the following:




Figure 68: AC7t1500ES0 Overlay File Directory Structure

#### Note



Before proceeding, make sure that write privileges are enabled for the ACE Install directory (usually C:  $\Achronix\ACE\$  version> $\Achronix\_CAD\_Environment\$ Achronix in Windows or /opt /Achronix—Linux in Linux). Also, if using Windows, run the unzip program as administrator by right-clicking the unzip program and selecting **More**  $\rightarrow$  **Run as Administrator**.

Extract the contents of the tar file into the ACE Install directory. ACE now allows the selection of device(s).




Figure 69: ACE Design Preparation Options Showing the Added Devices

## Synplify Pro Overlays

Synplify Pro overlays are delivered as a zip (for Windows) or tar (for Linux) file, with the name indicating the applicable version of Synplify Pro and the custom devices supported. For example, synS-2021.09X-2\_speedster7t\_all\_overlay.zip represents the overlays for the Speedster7t FPGA and Speedcore eFPGA IP evaluation devices, with the overlays applying to version S-2021.09X-2 of Synplify-Pro.



#### Caution!

Ensure that the overlay downloaded matches the version of Synplify Pro that is to be updated. If a new version of Synplify Pro is subsequently used, a new overlay file must be requested from Achronix.

After the zip or tar files are downloaded, extract them and continue to the next section.

### Applying the Overlay

- 1. Locate the subdirectory /lib (if using Linux) or \lib (if using Windows) within the Synplify Pro installation directory.
- All of the files from the extracted overlay directories should then be copied to their equivalent locations in the Synplify Pro installation directory. However, if other overlays have been downloaded, it might be necessary to manually merge some files.

#### Note



If using Linux, files /lib/generic/custom\_partdata.txt and /lib/parts /custom\_parts.txt must be manually merged if they already exist in the Synplify Pro installation. In both instances, add the contents of the new overlay file to the existing file using a text editor. If using Windows, the file paths instead are \lib\generic\custom\_partdata.txt and \lib\parts\custom\_parts.txt.

3. To ensure that all new devices have been installed, launch Synplify Pro. The splash screen should indicate that the new devices have been detected.




Figure 70: Synplify Pro Splash Screen

- 4. To confirm the parts are correctly installed, after opening Synplify Pro, create a new project.
- 5. Select Implementation Options → Device.

6. The new parts should be available in the "Part:" drop-down list.




Figure 71: Synplify Pro Implementation Options Screen
